CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTIONS

1.1 Background

Language is a tool of communication used by all levels of society to express and describe their feelings. Trianto (2008:90), say that language is an expression of human communication through knowledge, belief, and behaviour that can be experienced, explained, and disseminated. Evan and Levinson (2009), say that every language has its own uniqueness which makes it different from other languages. Language usually has variation in terms of form sound, meaning and structure. Martinez (2015), define that Language is nothing but human subjects in as much as they speak, say and know. Language is something coming from the inside of the speaking subject manifest in the meaningful intentional purpose of the individual speaker.

East Nusa Tenggara is province which has many islands, culture and languages. People in East Nusa Tenggara usually call it as Flobamora. Flobamora means, Flores, Sumba, Timor, and Alor. They are flanked by small islands. Such as, Sabu island, Rote, Samau etc. Alor is regency in east Nusa Tenggara province which has many islands, cultures and languages. There are eighteen local languages, such as (*Alores/ Alurung, Kabola/ Adang. Pronoun is one of the parts of speech. Each language has its own pronoun system. There are some examples of the pronoun system of some languages.

There is a difference between English pronouns for third person singular based on gender. The pronouns for male and female are different (*He &she, him & her, his & her*). Meanwhile, in Indonesian and Alurung language, there are no differences terms of its pronoun. Both male and female have the same pronoun (*dia*). Pronoun is an interesting topic to be learned. The writer chooses to analyse pronouns because the pronouns of each language has its own characteristics and uniqueness that makes it different from others.
