CHAPTER V

CONCLUSIONS AND SUGGESTIONS

This chapter presents some conclusions and suggestions dealing withresults obtained through the data analysis.

5.1. Conclusion

Based on these findings, the writer can conclude that:

- The writer found 75 homonym words in Dela-oenale language but the writer did not find any type of homograph. Homonyms in the Dela-Oenale language are mainly related to the aspect of meaning and also based on data analysis. Homonyms are words that have the same spelling and pronunciation but have different meanings.
- 2. The writer did not find homophone words in the Dela-Oenale language but the writer found 11 homophone-like words.

After analyzing the data, the conclusion of the writer handles the research problem. The writer conclude that there are homonyms and homophone-like words in the Dela-Oenale language.

5.2 Suggestion

Based on the findings and discussion above, the writer conveys several suggestions for the application of research results for English students as future teachers, readers and researchers. Here are the suggestions:
