

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSIONS AND SUGGESTIONS

This chapter presents some conclusions and suggestions dealing with results obtained through the data analysis.

5.1. CONCLUSIONS

Based on the data gained the writer can be concluded the writer found there are eight kinds of meanings which used in the selected poems of Rudyard Kipling from fourteen kinds of meaning. The kinds are repetition, metaphor, personification, synecdoche, hyperbole, metonymy, understatement and apostrophe.

The dominant kind of figurative language that contained in the selected poems of Rudyard Kipling is repetition.

The researcher also gives the explanation about the meaning of figurative language in these poems. There are many kinds of meaning which contains in all of poems. Generally, Rudyard Kipling's poems tell about wisdom and advice of life whereas the third poems tell about his city experienced times of trouble and struggle to find peace.
