

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTIONS

This chapter presents some conclusions and suggestions. Based on the result of the research discussion and following the purpose of the study, the writer presents the following conclusions and suggestions.

5.1 Conclusion

After analyzing the types, function and meaning of affixation found in the Anakalang Dialect, the writer concluded that the analysis of the affixation process of the Anakalang Dialect, in Pondok Village, Umbu Ratu Nggay Barat District, Central Sumba Regency, the writer found two types of affixation, namely: prefixes and suffixes. The prefix consists of *ha-*, *ka-*, *ma-*, *na-*, *pa-*, and *ta* and the suffix consists of *-da*, *-na*, and *-ngu*.

Affixes in the Anakalang dialect, Pondok Village, Umbu Ratu Nggay Barat District, Central Sumba Regency, when attached to some of the basic forms of the Anakalang dialect, can cause morphological and phonological processes in their formation. The meaning of affixes in the Anakalang dialect will have different meanings according to the basic form they are attached to, while the function affixes in the Anakalang dialect can be derivational or inflectional, affixes in the Anakalang dialect can function as forming word classes according to the basic form they are attached to, either which are in the category of verbs, nouns, adjectives, numerals or those which are in the category of other word classes.

5.2 Suggestion

Based on the conclusions above, the writers provide the following suggestions:

1. It is recommended that students majoring in English should be able to understand and know more about affixation, especially the types of affixation.
2. It is recommended for other students do further research on the affixation of regional languages using a different theory from this research, so that they can find out the types of affixation and the meaning of affixation in regional languages.
3. Suggestions for further writers to be able to use references in this study if they want to research affixation.
4. For academics, this research is expected to be an inspiration and reference for research related to affixation so that it can improve linguistics studies, especially in the field of morphology.
