According to Soekarningsi and Rohayani (2014:68). Traditional Dance is a dance that is born and grows in a society which is then passed down or passed on continuously from generation to generation. Traditional Dances usually have

various characteristics that light local philosophy, culture, and wisdom where the dance develops so that it can be guessed that each region will have its own uniqueness in an area. for example in the Alor district with its *Lego-Lego* Dance.

Lego-LegoDance is classified as a traditional Dance which is one of the cultural treasures that has been passed down from generation to generation from ancestors. It is commonly used in all traditional ceremonial activities in Alor. However now moreit is widely used when welcoming guests, at weddings, and so onby the people of Alor and is still beingpreserved now. or after carrying out joint activities as a form of gratitude, their sense of unity and joy. They express their gratitude by walking around the Mesbah (sacred holy place), while holding hands and singing songs of praise to God.

In general, it can be seen that the *Lego-Lego*Dance in Alor Regency has the meaning, Symbol, and the actualization togetherness or the unity of the Alor community. The spirit of mutual cooperation, a supportive attitude is the meaning about the *Lego-Lego*Dance.Suchas with choreographed footwork, the dancer will move around the tree while betel nut and *sop*i are offered. Foot movements and singing in each region may differ, but the shape of the circle formation and other traditional components remain the same.

Based on the explanation above and the experience from observation, unfinished pharase of so are found in traditional *Lego-Lego*Dance in Alor Regency, Practiced by *Ternate Umapura* Villager.
