

CHAPTER V

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTION

5.1. CONCLUSION

This study summarized as the following conclusions based on the results of the data analysis of Metaphors found in the North Amanatun Dialect in previous chapter:

1. There are four types of metaphors that were detected in the recorded data from 10 speakers as the informants of North Amanatun Dialect of Uab Meto. Anthropomorphic Metaphor, Synesthetic Metaphor, Abstract to Concrete Metaphor, and Animal Metaphor were the four categories of metaphor. From Abstract to Concrete Metaphor was the most prevalent sort of metaphor in the North Amanatun Dialect of Uab Meto, with a total 12 sentences. Second, there were 5 sentences for each in Anthropomorphic Metaphor and Synesthetic Metaphor. Animal Metaphor came in third, with a total 2 sentences.

2. The most dominant type of metaphors Spoken by North Amanatun People was Abstract to Concrete Metaphor. It was proven that there were 12 sentences as Abstract to Concrete Metaphor. In this types the sentences mostly had an expression that allude to anything abstract or imprecise (for example, a feeling or something that humans can experience) are handled as alive so that they can perform tangible or animate action.
