INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background

Vocabulary refers to the collection of words used in a language and plays a crucial role in an individual's communication ability. According to Nation (2001), a weak vocabulary can hinder students' ability to express complex thoughts persuasively in public speaking contexts. With a larger vocabulary, students can more easily convey their ideas and thoughts clearly and effectively, enabling them to achieve greater success in language use.
