CHAPTER V

CONCLUSIONS AND SUGGESTIONS

In this chapter, the writer would like to give some conclusions and suggestions dealing with the results obtained through the data analysis and discussion based on the title The use of speech act of sewu api (A Traditional ceremony of lio Ethnict) . This study aimed to answer research questions about The use of speech act of sewu api (A Traditional ceremony of Lio Ethnict). Therefore, based on the result, the writer presented the following conclusions and suggestions.

5.1. Conclusions

Afters analyzing the data on the speech act of the Sewu Api ceremony in the Ende Lio community the author concluded:

- 1. In the *Sewu Api* ceremony the speech act used are different from everyday language, because in the Sewu Api event, speaker usually use traditional language, parables and traditional language which have special language.
- 2. In the *Sewu Api* ceremony every year the landlord and the community must perform the ceremonyif they do not perform the traditional ceremony there are obstacles such as a disaster that will sway the violage.
- 3. In the *Sewu Api* ceremony researchers only found that there were ten speech acts communly used by landlords in the ceremony.
- In the Sewu Api ceremony, speech acts commonly used by landlords such as:
 - 1) Act of greetingThe act of pleading

- 2) Speech acts of praise
- 3) Speech Act of Asking
- 4) Promised Speech acts
- 5) Speech acts suggest
- 6) Waring speech acts
- 7) The speech act of Confirming
- 8) Spech Act gratitude
- 9) Speech Act Ask

5.2. Suggestions

Based on the conclusion above, the writer would to like to sugest that :

- 1. The researchers hope that there will be further research on speech act in the Sewu Api ceremony in the Lio community to enrich linguistics.
- 2. The author hopes that readers, especially those in the Lio Ethnict to under standing the process Speech Act of Sewu Api Ceremony.
- 3. The author hopes that the Specch act in the *Sewu Api* ceremony need to be taught to the youngers generation so that there are those who are able to become spokerspersons in the future.
