In the lamaholot culture when we talk to someone and suddenly our hand fold in the back, that meaning we

don't respect or not like to the personal and the same meaning if people talk to us with fold hand in the back. Those are one of body language that expressed by Lamaholot or show crumple face means they do not like or agree with the speaker.
